# MESSAGE FROM MRS HORN

Hello! Welcome to the Summer Term!

### **Transition to Junior school**

This is also the start of the time of year where the children being the transition process to their allocated junior schools. As you are aware most of the children at Mount Street feed into Westgate Junior school. For many years we have had a very comprehensive transition programme with the school and this year is no different. Miss Parker Y2 leader, Mrs Horton SENDCo and myself have met with key members of staff from Westgate to organise visits for the children and for staff to visit us here at school for discussion talks. I also work very closely with the Headteacher John Beaven and Julia Marshall Headteacher of Eastgate infants (Who also feed their children into Westgate) to ensure the children have the best experience possible and are fully prepared for their new school. ### Bromcom

As you are aware we are now using Bromcom as our Management Information System. You should have received your link to register. If you have not yet registered please click on this <u>link</u> and simply reset your password. All parents/carers with parental responsibility will have an account by default (username is the email we hold on record). Access to Bromcom allows you to amend things like parental consents and update personal details.

Bromcom is also replacing Parenthub as our school to home communication platform. This means that you will now receive emails and any other information from school to your Bromcom account.

### Absence

Registration takes place first thing in the morning. If your child is absent from school please provide a reason by 9 a.m. This can be done on the voicemail absence line or emailing enquiries. If we have not been provided with a reason for the absence, you will be sent an automated email via Bromcom asking you to contact the school and provide us with a reason for your child's absence, this needs to be done by 10:30 a.m.

# YEAR 1 NEWS

It was lovely to meet with most of you for Parent's Evening last week; we thoroughly enjoyed sharing with you the fantastic progress all your children have made.

### **Reading and Writing:**

This term in Phonics we are revisiting Phase 5 GPC's that we already know, alongside reading 'nonsense' words. This is in preparation for the Phonics Screening Check, which is a check where children need to read 40 real and nonsense words. Nonsense are words that are made up, but contain the GPC's learned in Phonics. We are also continuing to practise reading with fluency and expression and this is something that the children are working very hard on.

In Writing, we have just started the story 'Lost and Found'; this is a story about a little boy who finds a penguin. The main outcome for this text is for children to be able to write their own losing or finding narrative. We have recently been learning about adverbs, imperative verbs and have written our own non-chronological report about penguins.

### Maths:

This past week in Maths we have been counting in 2's, 5's and 10's – this is something that you could practise at home with your child if you wish. There are plenty of online games to develop the skill of counting in 2's, 5's and 10's. It is important that children are able to do this to support them with repeated addition and then multiplication. We have also been looking at groups and if they are equal or not. Next week, we will be starting to look at arrays and identify how many rows/columns there are. Perhaps when you are out and about with your child(ren) you might want to see if you can spot any real-life arrays?

### Some examples:

### Science:

Last term and continuing into this term, we have been learning about plants. We have learned abut the parts of a plant and their functions; wild and garden plants; trees; and deciduous and evergreen trees. Last week we planted our very own bean plant and we learned about what a plant needs to be able to grow. We are going to take very good care of our plants, and each week in our Science lessons, we are going to look at our plants and see how well they have grown. We have also planted some beans that: 1. We do not water; 2. Does not get any sunlight; and 3. Is not kept at the right temperature. We will then compare these to how ours are growing.

### Other areas of learning

In Computing we are developing our keyboard skills using Word; we are starting to learn about the different things we can do using the toolbar. In Geography we are learning about the continents and the hot and cold areas of the world. In Art, we are just about to start learning about Pop Art as a style of art. We will be looking at Andy Warhol and the famous pieces that he created and then we will be having a go at creating our own.
